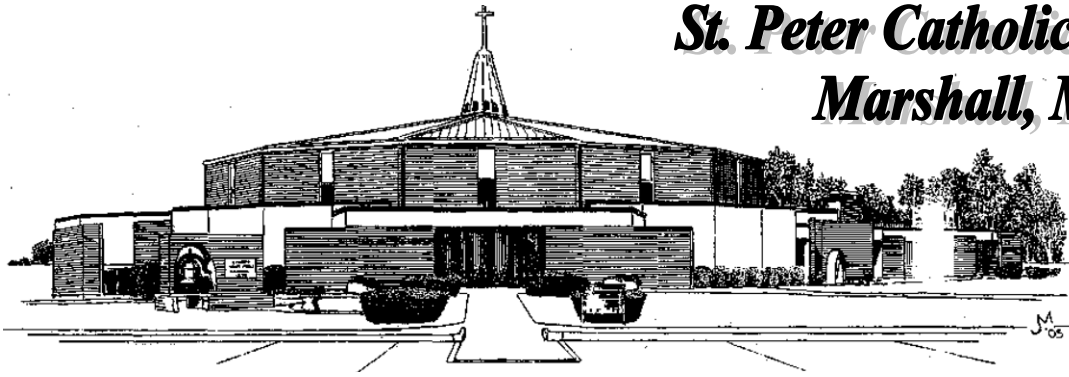

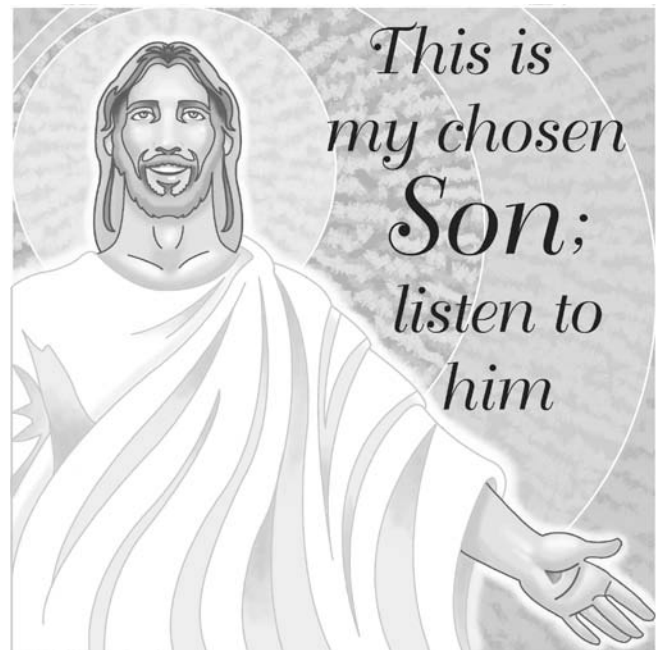

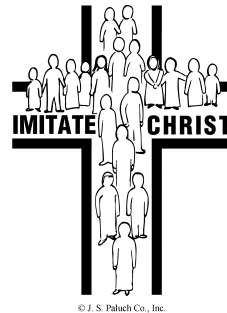

Policy for student FEES for employees at St. Peter School:

It was voted on and passed at the last meeting. The policy reads as follows: "All current employees of St. Peter Catholic School may bring their children to school here at the following rates: \$300 for the 1st child and \$100 for all others subject to a \$500 family maximum. This applies to children in any level/grade including pre-school. For non-Catholic employees hired for the 2010-2011 school year and after, the fee will be \$300 per child for any level/grade including pre-school. In addition, all Catholic employees are expected to comply with the covenant agreement in regard to church contributions and all non-Catholic faculty and staff are expected to tithe to their own churches." Currently, children of employees pay only for lunch and other "extras", non-sustaining and or tuition fees.

Make-up Days: We will be making up our missed days as follows: May 20th & 21st with the ending date of school for students to be on May 21st now instead of the 19th. Graduation for pre-school will be on Thurs., May 20th at 1pm & at 6:30pm on the 20th as well for the 8th grade students. **Our 3rd day** will be made up by **extending the day an extra 30 minutes** on the following days: **March 3rd, 4th, March 9th, 10th, 11th, 16th, 17th, 23rd, 24th, 25th, and the 30th of March.** On these days, grades k-8 will dismiss at 3:30pm instead of the usual 3:00pm.

We will have an **early dismissal day on Thurs., March 18th** as we **let out at 1pm for our 3rd quarter** parent-teacher conferences. We hope to see you that day at a conference with your child's teacher. And, remember as always, that our After Care program will run through it's usual 5:30pm time that day.

We are underway with the school calendar for next year, working on the budget and beginning to plan for next year's classes. Along these lines, one of the most important if not the most important item to help us in that endeavor is our pre-registration for next school year. These dates being on **March 10th with our Kindergarten Round-up at 6:30pm** in the chapel, continue on with **pre-school registration on March 18th from 7:30am to 6pm** here at the school office, and wind up with 3 times for grades **k-8 to pre-register those being on April 13th from 7:30-8:30am, again on the 13th from 5:30-7:30pm and the last time will be on the next day, April 14th from 5:30-7:30pm.** Again, I cannot overemphasize the importance of this event as we use it to plan for the next year.

Track Practice: As part of our co-operative agreement with Bueker Middle School, our students in grades 7 and 8 are able to run track with the students from Bueker. Anyone wanting to do so, stop by the office as pick up a practice and meet schedule from Christin. Sarah Wright is the coach for Bueker and she has contacted us to let our students know that **practice begins March 8th!!** More information is available to those interested on the schedules in the office.

- 1 in 3 female teens in a dating relationship has feared for her physical safety.
- Between 1993 & 1999, 22% of all homicides against females ages 16 to 19 were committed by an intimate partner.
- 50-80% of teens report knowing someone involved in a violent relationship
- 24% of 14 to 17 year olds know at least 1 student who has been the victim of dating violence

IMMIGRATION REFORM: The U.S. Catholic Bishops acknowledge that immigration is an emotional and challenging issue which has engaged the American public, including members of the Catholic faithful. Each day in our parishes, social service programs, hospitals, and schools we witness the human consequences of an immigration system which is seriously flawed: families are divided, migrants are exploited and abused by smugglers and human traffickers, and in some cases, men, women and children who attempt to come here in search of a better life perish in the American desert and on the seas. Because of these realities, we believe that the status quo is morally unacceptable and must be changed. New laws regulating immigration and also border security are very important. Our immigration laws should be just and humane and reflect the values -fairness, opportunity, and compassion, upon which our nation, a nation of immigrants, was built. They urge the United States Congress to make progress in this regard. We are urged by our bishop to write to our legislators in Washington, D.C. We will provide assistance in doing this next week, giving you a chance to sign your name to a postcard directed to Senators Bond, McCaskill, and U.S. Rep. Ike Skelton.

How Old Is Your Church?

If you are a Lutheran, your religion was founded by Martin Luther, an ex- monk of the Catholic Church, in the year 1517.
If you belong to the Church of England, your religion was founded by King Henry VIII in the year 1534 because the Pope would not grant him a divorce with the right to remarry.
If you are a Presbyterian, your religion was founded by John Knox in Scotland in the year 1560.
If you are a Protestant Episcopalian, your religion was an offshoot of the Church of England founded by Samuel Seabury in the American colonies in the 17th century.
If you are a Congregationalist, your religion was originated by Robert Brown in Holland in 1582.
If you are a Methodist, your religion was launched by John and Charles Wesley in England in 1744.
If you are a Unitarian, Theophilus Lindley founded your church in London in 1774.
If you are a Mormon (Latter Day Saints), Joseph Smith started your religion in Palmyra, N.Y., in 1829.
If you are a Baptist, you owe the tenets of your religion to John Smyth, who launched it in Amsterdam in 1605.
If you are of the Dutch Reformed church, you recognize Michaelis Jones as founder, because he originated your religion in New York in 1628.
If you worship with the Salvation Army, your sect began with William Booth in London in 1865.
If you are a Christian Scientist, you look to 1879 as the year in which your religion was born and to Mrs. Mary Baker Eddy as its founder.
If you belong to one of the religious organizations known as 'Church of the Nazarene,' 'Pentecostal Gospel,' 'Holiness Church,' 'Pilgrim Holiness Church,' 'Jehovah's Witnesses,' your religion is one of the hundreds of new sects founded by men within the past century.
If you are Catholic, you know that your religion was founded in the year 33 by Jesus Christ the Son of God, and it is still the same Church.
