OUR FASCINATING FAITH

Candlemas (February 2)

Thanks to Pope Sergius I (687–701), on February 2 we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord. On this day we also commemorate the Purification of Mary, who complied with the Jewish law (Leviticus 12:1). The law indicated that a mother should be purified forty days after giving birth to a boy child. Since the eleventh century the Purification of Mary and the Presentation of the Lord have been celebrated with the blessing of all the candles and candlesticks that are going to be used during the year. This is done with the hope that there will never be a lack of light, either material or spiritual, in the houses of the faithful. The root of the word candlemas is the Latin verb *candere* (“to shine”) and from which also come the words *candelabra* and *candlestick*. This feast of candles recalls that Christians can, like Simon and the prophetess Anna in the temple, say that they also have seen salvation: Jesus the true Light who shines in the arms of Mary (Luke 2:25–38).

NUESTRA FASCINANTE FE

La Candelaria

Gracias al Papa Sergio I (687–701), el día 2 de febrero se celebra la Presentación de Jesús en el Templo. En este día se conmemora también la Purificación de María que cumplía con la Ley Judía (Levítico 12:1–2). Dicha ley indicaba que una madre debía ser purificada cuarenta días después de que diera a luz a un varoncito. Desde el undécimo siglo, la celebración de la Purificación de María y la Presentación del Niño Jesús en el templo se conmemoran con la bendición de todas las velas y veladoras que se van a usar durante el año. Esto se hace con la esperanza de que nunca falte la luz, tanto material como espiritual en las casas de los fieles. La palabra *candelaria* viene del verbo latín *candere* (brillar), de allí la palabra *candela*, o sea, *veladora*. Esta fiesta de candelas recuerda que los cristianos como Simeón y la profetiza Ana en el Templo pueden decir que ellos también han visto la salvación; Jesús la verdadera luz que brilla en brazos de María (Lucas 2:25–38).

From the principal, Mrs. Mary McCoy

I am speaking to you for two reasons today. Number one - we would love to see our parish children in our parish school. Students have the opportunities to participate in soccer, basketball, track, music, plays, academic bowls, spelling bees and speech and debate. We like to provide as many opportunities as possible for our students from sports to performing arts activities so that students have the chance to explore and to develop their unique talents.

Finally, we offer financial assistance to make our fees affordable. One of the misconceptions of a parochial school is the cost attached. We want to make sure our parish families know and understand that having our parish families enrolled in our parish schools is our top priority. Our school policies treat students equally and promote a healthy learning atmosphere and friendly culture. We want you to be a part of our school, we want your children in our school, we want to help your children grow in faith, and we want them to succeed academically. If there are any obstacles, financial or otherwise, that are preventing you from making the choice to call St. Peter Catholic School home for your children, please reach out to me directly so we can work together to overcome them.

Our School is its own small village, with its own small staff - each member invested in the success of its children. We want to do more than bridge the gap between church and school. Our dream is to be able to greet all of our parish children in our school doors.

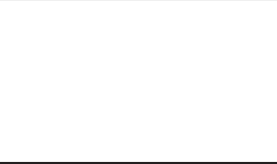
